Course Overview

The Connecticut Trauma Conference is a forum in which complex and controversial issues affecting the care of the trauma patient are presented and discussed by nationally and locally recognized experts in all aspects of trauma care. The conference goal is to provide insight into issues and problems related to the optimal care of the trauma patient. This year's conference focuses on ethical and sociological issues surrounding end-of-life decision making in trauma care, injury prevention, the civilian/military interface in pre-hospital trauma care, and rehabilitation of the amputee, as well as perplexing management problems in cardiac and pediatric trauma surgery. Participants will be provided with a comprehensive overview of new techniques and technologies available to providers responsible for caring for the trauma patient. Diagnostic, resuscitative, and management interventions for traumatic injuries will be examined.

Course Objectives

1. To review and discuss present concepts of management in the areas of cardiac and thoracic trauma.
2. To review and discuss the roles of hospitals, trauma centers, trauma systems, and the public in injury and trauma prevention programs.
3. To examine the civilian and military pre-hospital/trauma care systems, and determine the optimal mix of both.
4. To examine the complex ethical and psycho-sociological issues of end-of-life care in trauma care.
5. To discuss and review the past, present, and future for the rehabilitation of spinal cord injured patients and amputees.
6. To examine current concepts in pediatric trauma care.
